## DIRECTIONS

From Asheboro...

Take Exit 51 (Ulah-Troy Exit) off Interstate 73/74 south of Asheboro. Turn right at the end of exit ramp, onto Dawson-Miller Road. Take Dawson-Miller Road approximately 1.5 miles until it runs into Pisgah Covered Bridge Road and continue for approximately 5.7 miles to where Pisgah Covered Bridge Road forks to the right. Go approximately 1.5 miles; the entrance to parking for the bridge is on the left—just past Union Community Building.

From Seagrove...

Take I-73/74/Hwy 220, to exit 49 and follow the signs.

## THE PISGAH COVERED BRIDGE

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The Pisgah Covered Bridge is one of two surviving covered bridges in the state, and the only one easily accessible by the public.

The 54-foot wooden structure was built over a branch of the Little River, 10 miles southwest of Asheboro, in 1911.

The bridge is a great spot for photography, picnics and nature walks along the surrounding quarter-mile walking trail. Picnic tables are available, as well as public parking.

Other exciting area attractions include the Seagrove Potteries, Richard Petty Museum, and the North Carolina Zoo!

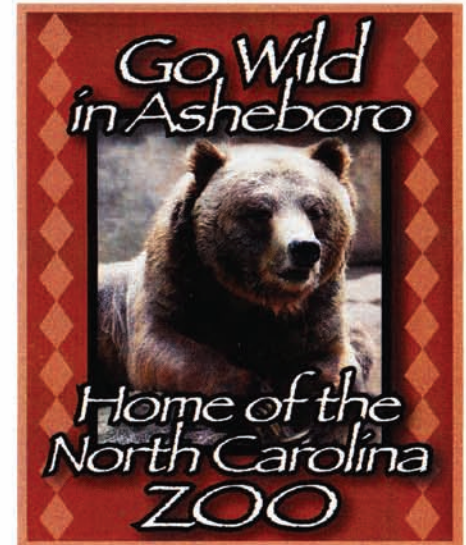
