The mission of Victory Junction is to enrich the lives of children with chronic medical conditions or serious illnesses by providing life-changing, camping experiences that are exciting, fun and empowering, in a safe and medically-sound environment.



Victory Junction

When Victory Junction opened in Randleman, N.C., in 2004 in honor of their son, Adam, Kyle and Pattie Petty envisioned a place of happiness, joy and life-changing camping experiences that would be free of charge to children and families. From this vision, Victory Junction was formed.

Victory Junction is a year-round camping facility that serves children, ages 6 to 16, with chronic medical conditions or serious illnesses. During the summer, Victory Junction offers disease-specific sessions with up to 128 children per session. During the fall, winter and spring, family weekends are offered to up to 32 families per weekend.

Plans are underway to build a second camp in Kansas City, Kan., so that children in the Midwest can benefit from a life-changing camping experience.

Victory Junction is a member of the Association of Hole in the Wall Camps founded by Paul Newman and is accredited by the rigorous guidelines of the American Camping Association.



Program & Medical Staff

At Victory Junction, the number one concern is a child's safety. Counselors and volunteers, along with specialty doctors, advanced practice providers, nurses and a fully-equipped medical center, are available 24-hours a day to handle any kind of need.
